Are you happy where you are?

He has learned how to get over not just addiction but also spoiling a wonderful life. But he's happy, he's resolved, and he feels good about himself.

Do you miss being on earth?

Not now, but he did for quite a while because it was the best life that he'd had in a long time. This was the life where he could have gotten the help to get out of what he was doing to hurt himself. He had all the friends in the world and the money to go to whatever therapist, clinic or institution he needed. The biggest issue in his life wasn't really the drugs or alcohol but the need for approval.

Do you spend time with John Belushi?

He has indeed spent time with him. John was actually there to greet him.

What about John Candy?

"John Candy and I are hanging out right now," he says. One thing that he and John Candy have in common is that they both made people very happy. Both of them feel happy, and they use that word together—they're like twins up there!

Who else besides comedians are you hanging out with, Chris?

It looks like there's an old woman he's close to, a grandparent of his...and Oscar Wilde. He's very Catholic and there's a saint he used to pray to, St. Patrick, whom he hangs around with. Another person with him is Princess Grace. She was his mother in another lifetime.

Are there drugs in heaven? Is that something you're still interested in?

We're no longer on a physical plane when we're between lives, so spirits don't have the same yearnings for things. They observe us down here having cravings for chocolate or drugs or whatever else, but they're detached.

What would you be up to if you were still alive?

He would have been in a three-movie series with David Spade; it looks like it has a space theme to it. He would have settled down with somebody. He's a stud.

Do you still communicate with Spade?

Yes, I know that they are still talking to each other, and I knew that even before I saw Chris nodding his head and rolling his eyes.

Have you got your eyes on people who might be making the same mistakes as you?

Absolutely. Right now, Chris is helping several folks. He said that he wasn't one of the people to meet Richard Pryor on the other side, but he's been around since he died. Chris is helping to greet people when they get to the other side. He said if he had known how much help and protection there was for him from the other side, he would still be here.

Are you watching over any of the current cast of *Saturday Night Live*?

Maya Rudolph. She is an old friend from many, many lifetimes. Chris just said that Maya, Chris and I were all in a life together as brothers and sisters in England.

Robert Downey Jr. seems to be someone who is trying to get his life together. Are you helping him out as well, Chris?

Absolutely, but Robert is being helped by Phil Hartman even more. It's going to be hard for him, though. Robert has a 63 percent chance of making it.
